## National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs) Training Academy Objectives

Upon completion of the NamUs Training Academy, participants will be able to:

- 1. Describe the overall framework and objectives of the NamUs system.
- 2. Describe the history, development, and functionality of the NamUs system.
- 3. Identify individual and agency "roles and responsibilities" regarding the investigation of missing and unidentified persons.
- 4. Identify sources for obtaining case information relative to missing and unidentified persons.
- 5. Demonstrate quality case data entry on the NamUs system for missing persons and unidentified persons.
- 6. Describe the basic sequence of events and personnel involved in typical missing persons' cases.
- 7. Identify critical missing person case issues relevant to the NamUs system, including case management.
- 8. Describe the basic sequence of events and personnel involved in unidentified persons' cases.
- 9. Describe critical unidentified person case issues relevant to the NamUs system, including case management.
- 10. Demonstrate an understanding of the matches and exclusions features of the NamUs system.
- 11. Construct a PowerPoint presentation for use in "state-based" NamUs education.
- 12. Commit to working with state team members (as appropriate) to advance the objectives of NamUs.
